SUMMARY (Cont'd)

Agreement Between the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District and Milwaukee County Regarding Wilson Park

The work identified in KKRWMP will have direct and indirect impact on County-owned facilities within Wilson Park. The District and County have developed an agreement that outlines environmental improvements to mitigate flood risk and address any negative impact on park land or amenities.

Under the ICA, the District will:

- update flood models to confirm the amount of flood storage required in the park,
- manage and contract for preliminary engineering and create a plan for the parkland impacted by the project,
- manage and contract for final design,
- lead and manage public outreach,
- provide the County with opportunities to review and comment on all designs prior to the public bidding phase,
- manage and contract for construction,
- pay the County for trees removed within the project area,
- perform long-term maintenance of the naturalized stream and assist the County with post-flood remediation of impacted areas of the park,
- obtain all regulatory approvals and permits required for the work,
- provide record drawings to the County upon completion of the work, and
- during project construction, assist the County with debris removal between the watercourse banks on all County property risking blocking jurisdictional waterways' ability to convey floodwaters up to \$250,000 per year.

The County will:

- provide input throughout the project,
- provide all County permits at no cost to the District,
- grant the District a permanent flood easement for the parkland identified in the one percent annual probability floodplain,
- grant the District a permanent maintenance easement,
- allow District access as requested for the project at no cost to the District, and
- pay for any additional work the District performs at County request.

RESOLUTION

Agreement Between the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District and Milwaukee County Regarding Wilson Park

RESOLVED, by the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage Commission, that the Executive Director is authorized to execute an intergovernmental cooperation agreement between the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District and Milwaukee County regarding Wilson Park.

FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage Commission, that the Executive Director is authorized to execute intergovernmental cooperation agreement-related easement documents, jurisdictional offers, awards of compensation damages, leases, purchase agreements, deeds of conveyance, permits, licenses, or any other related real estate documents.
