#### BACKGROUND

Change Order Two Request, Contract P-3130, Fresh Coast Works Ambassadors

In 2023, the District received \$1 million in grant funding from the United States Department of Labor to undertake workforce programs over a period of three years (2023-2025). The grant is being used to fund apprenticeships, on-the-job training, skills building, and paid work experience. In 2023, the District released a request for proposal to create a second Fresh Coast Ambassador workforce crew to be comprised of young adults between the ages of 18-24 years old. MCSC was selected for this contract through this competitive process. The original contract included one crew of eight Fresh Coast Ambassadors in 2023 at a cost of \$88,000, with the option for annual renewal for up to five years.

Delays in grant contracting delayed the original schedule, and the contract was amended in November 2023 to allow for two cohorts of eight Fresh Coast Ambassadors each to be formed in 2024 for a total of \$176,000, an \$88,000 increase. The first cohort of eight Fresh Coast Ambassadors started the program on April 1, 2024, and completed it on June 28, 2024. The second cohort of eight Fresh Coast Ambassadors will begin on August 1, 2024, and complete on October 31, 2024. The two cohorts in 2024 will have a total of 16 participants. Change Order Two allows for a second year (2025) of the program that will include spring and summer cohorts and additional MCSC staff labor for recruitment and retention for a total of \$184,000. This increases the total contract cost to \$360,000.

The program objective is to train participants to acquire the required skills to enter and complete a pre-apprenticeship program that introduces them to careers in the water industry, specifically green infrastructure, flood management, land stewardship, and forestry. The program's curriculum is centered on job readiness, career exploration, experience, and career path development.

### The program will:

- 1. Provide an opportunity for adults to receive training, certifications, and work experience in the water industry and conservation and stewardship careers.
- 2. Provide participants with an informative service-learning experience.
- 3. Provide leaders with high quality training and career readiness services.
- 4. Empower participants to realize their personal leadership potential, cultivate a conservation ethic, commit to lifelong environmental stewardship, and value service work to other people, the land, and water.
- 5. Introduce participants to new career possibilities with existing paths via apprenticeship or local higher education programs.

#### Goals

- 1. A total of 32 or more participants will receive hands-on green infrastructure training and participate in service projects over a period of two years.
- Participants and leaders will participate in at least two future career planning sessions.

- 3. Each participant will receive a professional resume and display proficiency in interviewing skills.
- 4. Each participant will complete the program with a defined plan to seek and obtain full-time employment, further educational opportunities, or enter an apprenticeship.
- 5. The program will provide a wide breadth of experiences to explore potential water industry or conservation science careers.
- 6. Participants will register with the Wisconsin Job Center at the end of the program.

### RESOLUTION

Change Order Two Request, Contract P-3130, Fresh Coast Works Ambassadors

**RESOLVED**, by the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage Commission, that the Executive Director is authorized to execute Change Order Two to Contract P-3130, Fresh Coast Works Ambassadors, with the Milwaukee Community Service Corps, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$184,000 for a total contract cost of \$360,000 and to extend the contract completion date to January 31, 2026.
