## Background

Award Contract P-2674 to Ecoplast and Packaging LLC to Provide Packaging Materials for the Bagging of Milorganite® Fertilizers

Milorganite® brand fertilizers are shipped in a variety of configurations. Bagged products are the most popular stock keeping units with an anticipated 1.7 million packaged units in 2016, in sizes ranging from five pounds to one ton. Recyclable poly packaging for five-, 36-, and 50-pound units are currently required from plastic bag manufacturers.

The current packaging materials contract for Milorganite® products, held by Polymer Packaging, Inc., expires December 31, 2016. In preparation for the competitive bid process, staff reached out to the industry to alert and familiarize firms that have not previously worked on public sector bids of the approaching opportunity and process. An invitation to bid was sent to seven interested firms, publicly noticed in the paper of record (Daily Reporter), and posted on the District's website. Potential suppliers were required to submit bids for packaging materials for the District's retail and professional Milorganite® bags. Four firms submitted bids: Ecoplast and Packaging LLC, Direct Plastics Novolex, Trinity Packaging Corp, and the Inteplast Group.

Based on review of the bids submitted and evaluation of sample materials, staff identified Ecoplast and Packaging LLC as the low responsible, responsive bidder with a bid amount of \$454,510 per year based on staff's estimates for bidding purposes. Ecoplast and Packaging LLC has extensive experience in providing various types of packaging supplies to industry.

Staff recommends a three-year contract at a not-to-exceed amount of \$1,600,000 with a possible two-year extension based on satisfactory performance at an amount not to exceed \$550,000 per year. The contract includes provisions specifying performance values for packaging and an annual cost adjustment review based on Producer Price Index changes for packaging supplies.

Staff consistently scans customer needs and trends regarding packaging types and sizes. Ecoplast and Packaging LLC is offering to actively participate in reviewing trends and to offer advice and expertise on the best pathway to ensure packaging meets and exceeds customer requirements.

## **RESOLUTION**

Award Contract P-2674 to Ecoplast and Packaging LLC to Provide Packaging Materials for the Bagging of Milorganite® Fertilizers

**RESOLVED**, by the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage Commission, that Contract P-2674 is awarded to Ecoplast and Packaging LLC for providing packaging materials for the bagging of Milorganite® fertilizers at a total not-to-exceed amount of \$1,600,000 for three years with an option of two additional years (based on performance) in an amount not to exceed \$550,000 per year.
