Update to the Menomonee River Watercourse Management Plan

Western Milwaukee Key Elements

The existing MRWMP identified the need for a levee to provide flood protection in the Western Milwaukee segment. Since then, the District has evaluated multiple alternatives to achieve the necessary level of flood protection and recommends the following key project elements for Western Milwaukee Phase 2B:

- 1,700 feet of earthen levee, up to eight feet high.
- 1,200 feet of concrete floodwall, up to 20 feet high.
- 200 feet of combination floodwall on top of earthen levee, up to eight feet high.
- Four new storm sewer systems, ranging in diameter from 15 inches to 72 inches, totaling 5,100 feet in length.
- 360 feet of relocated combined sewer overflow rectangular pipe (10-foot by five-foot).
- 500 feet of excavation and bank restoration along the south bank.
- 1,000 feet of excavation and bank restoration along the north bank.
- Turf and native plantings throughout project area.

In addition to these improvements, the update also proposes voluntary floodproofing or voluntary property acquisition of three residential and six commercial buildings immediately downstream of these Western Milwaukee elements.

These elements are shown in Attachment A.

<u>Additional Structures in Floodplain</u>

As the engineering analysis has proceeded, nine additional structures in the floodplain have been identified. These structures are located immediately upstream of the Western Milwaukee project area and are in the City of Wauwatosa. (See Attachment B.) Reducing the flood risk associated with these structures will be addressed by future projects, including the District's Schoonmaker Creek project. The Schoonmaker Creek project will be developed in coordination with work being performed by the City of Wauwatosa in the Schoonmaker Creek watershed.

Below is a table with an updated accounting of the number of structures in the floodplain.
